This is what **Beyond Vengeance**, **Beyond Duality** (Hampton Roads, May 2010) offers readers—a blueprint for transformative change that begins with a central pillar of our culture—how we define justice.

Because of her legal background, Sylvia Clute focuses on legal horror stories to demonstrate her underlying thesis: The crisis in our legal system is merely symptomatic of a rot found in many of our institutions and is rooted in a philosophy of dualism that pits us against one another. It is rooted in a philosophy that fails to recognize the oneness or unity of all life.

Beyond Vengeance, Beyond Duality will stimulate debate, controversy and a vision for fundamental change among politicians and policy makers, lawyers and law students, religious leaders and theology majors, entrepreneurs and business majors, peace practitioners and peace studies students, as well as every activist who is ready to work for meaningful reform.

Clute writes, "E pluribus unum, 'out of many, one,' is the motto of the United States adopted by the founding fathers. Consider its implications. It is a covenant that must extend to the people of all nations if it extends to any. Bahá'u'lláh, a Spiritual Master of the nineteenth century, provided insight in this regard when he explained the insufficiency of patriotism to one's particular nation – not that it is wrong, just incomplete in the face of the interdependence of all peoples of the world. Love of the boundaries that separate one country from another must not be placed above love of the world, home to all of us."
